Celebrating Rugby with the Carbine Club of Hong Kong: A Historic Lunch at The Kerry Hotel

With the electrifying atmosphere of rugby in the air, attendees gathered to celebrate the sport, network with fellow enthusiasts, and hear from some of the biggest names in rugby history.

As the lunch commenced, MC Andrew Macintosh welcomed everyone with an infectious enthusiasm that set the tone of the day. His charisma was well received by the crowd, which included rugby players, fans, and members of the local community. Andrew introduced the President of the Carbine Club, Peter Glanville, who took to the stage to extend his warm greetings to all attendees. Glanville expressed heartfelt appreciation for the club's enduring partnership with Cathay Pacific, highlighting their unwavering support over the years. He also thanked The Kerry Hotel for their flexibility and exceptional service in accommodating the club's varied requests.

Following his opening remarks, Glanville introduced the head table, featuring two renowned guest speakers: Brian Moore and Andrew Mehrstens. Each of these rugby icons brought their own rich experiences and stories from their illustrious careers to the gathering.



The first to speak was Brian Moore, affectionately known as "The Pitbull." A fierce competitor on the field, Moore captivated the audience with tales from his early days in Halifax and his subsequent career playing as an amateur for Nottingham. He recounted a particularly vivid story from his playing days in Wellington, New Zealand, where he famously responded to a fan who threw a full can of beer at him. In an act of defiance and humour, he picked up the can, opened it, and proceeded to skull its contents, engaging the crowd. Moore's anecdotes blended humour with rivalrous rivalry, beautifully reflecting the essence of rugby as a sport that thrives on passion and solidarity.

Following Moore's entertaining and nostalgic reminiscences, the attention turned to the auction segment of the event. Auctioneer George Lacey took the stage to facilitate bidding on a highly coveted four-ball experience at the esteemed Clearwater Bay Golf & Country Club. The auction was a resounding success, culminating in a winning bid of HKD 31,000 (approximately AUD 6,250), with the fortunate winner being Lars Asgard.

The final speaker of the day was Andrew Mehrtens, a name synonymous with New Zealand rugby. Recognized as one of the most influential first five-eighths in the history of the All Blacks, Mehrtens spoke with heartfelt humility about his storied career. He recounted unforgettable moments spent alongside rugby legends, particularly highlighting his camaraderie with the late Jonah Lomu. With passion in his voice, Mehrtens explored the cultural significance of the Haka, the traditional war dance of the Māori. He eloquently recited the words of the Haka, detailing its origins and the pride it instils in the All Blacks players. In a moment that will be etched in the memories of all present, he invited the audience to rise and join him in performing the Haka. With over 500 attendees standing together in unity, it was a majestic sight, a tribute to the power of rugby to forge connections among people from diverse backgrounds.
